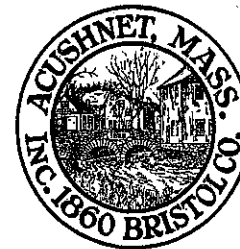

To the voters of the Town of Acushnet:

The Board of Health offers the following Annual report for the year 1927—

Immediately following the Annual election, the members having been duly sworn into office, the Board met and perfected the following organization.

Joel P. Bradford, M. D., Chairman	Term expires 1930
Fred E. Wellington, Sec. and Agent	Term expires 1928
Otto W. Melzer, Inspector Milk and Dairy Licenses	Term expires 1929

Allen E. Weeks and Abraham L. Dillingham were nominated as Inspectors of slaughtering, which nomination was confirmed previous to their being sworn into office.

Passage of a new Pasteurization milk law has added to the duties of the Board an intimate and thorough knowledge of the process of pasteurization as the law requires licensing and constant over sight of all Dairies distributing milk in our Town. This duty has been under the direct supervision of Mr. Melzer in conjunction with the full Board.

By arrangement with the School Board Medical Supervision of the schools has been for the first time placed directly under the Board of Health thus doing away with the old barrier of school children not being under the

Board of Health during school session. We believe this arrangement will materially assist the Board of Health in the control of contagious diseases. We are pleased to be able to report a small number of contagious diseases during the year.

During the year of 1927 I have issued 28 licenses to sell milk after having thoroughly inspected the premises and having found them in proper sanitary condition. I have issued in conjunction with the full Board 6 licenses for the pasteurization of milk after having passed the premises and equipment according to Chapter 259 revised laws and Acts 1927. Have issued 10 licenses for the sale of denatured alcohol in accordance with Chap. 94 and amendments 295A and 295E revised laws. Have issued one license for sale of Oleomargarine.

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby required and directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Acushnet, aforesaid who are qualified to vote in Elections and in Town affairs therein, to meet at the several designated POLLING PLACES in their respective PRECINCTS, in said Acushnet, to wit:

**In Precinct I — Polling Place,**

Acushnet Town Hall.

**In Precinct II — Polling Place**

Grange Hall

on Monday the Fifth (5) next, A. D. 1928 (it being the first Monday in March), at 8 o'clock in the forenoon, then and there to bring in to the Precinct Officers of their respective precincts their votes on one ballot for the following named Town Officers, to wit:

Town Clerk, Treasurer and Collector of Taxes for one year.

One Selectman and member to the Board of Public Welfare for three years.

One assessor for three years.

One School Committeeman for three years.

One member to the Board of Health for three years.

One Commissioner of Trust Funds for three years.

One Trustee of the Free Public Library for three years.

One member of the Cemetery Board for three years.

One member of the Cemetery Board for one year, (vacancy.)

One surveyor of Lumber for three years.

One Tree Warden for one year.

Moderator for one year.

One Park Commissioner for three years.

All of the above named Town Officers are to be voted for on one ballot.

You are hereby further required and directed to notify and warn the said inhabitants of the Town of Acushnet who are qualified to vote in elections and Town affairs therein to assemble subsequently and meet in Town Meeting at the Town Hall in said Acushnet, on Saturday the Tenth (10) next at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, then and there to act on the following subjects and business, viz:—

Article 1. To see if the Town will vote to determine the compensation which the several Town Officers shall receive and make an appropriation therefor.

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for incidental expenses.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Public Welfare.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Soldiers' and Sailors' Relief.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for Memorial purposes.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Free Public Library.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum for the suppression of Moths.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Treasurer with the approval of the Selectmen, to hire money from time to time in anticipation of the revenues of the current year and to issue notes of the Town therefor, and the debts incurred under the authority of this vote to be made payable from said revenue.

and Rubbish, also Ashes in the thickly settled part of the Town of Acushnet. (By Petition.)

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to accept Cleveland Street as a Town Way from South Main street to John Street. (By Petition.)

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to accept Cushman Street as a Town Way to No. 116 Cushman Street. (By Petition.)

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.—or any part thereof to scarify and oil and gravel the Middle Street road from where it stopped last year to Lake Street as early in spring as weather permits. (By Petition.)

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.—or any part thereof to scarify and oil and gravel the road called Leonard Street as early in spring as the weather permits. (By Petition.)

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.—or any part thereof to scarify and oil and gravel the road called Lake Street as early in spring as weather permits. (By Petition.)

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to install one electric light on the corner of North Main Street and Quaker Road, and make an appropriation therefor. (By Petition.)

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,000.—for repairs on Quaker Road ( By Petition.)

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.—for repairs on Cushing Lane. (By Petition.)

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to transfer and charge to the 1927 Revenue Surplus account, the overdrawn 1927 Notes and Interest account of \$1,233.38.

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for repairs to Jean Street from Nye Avenue to the Acushnet River. (By Petition.)

Article 39. To see if the Town will accept Allen Street, starting at Boylston Street West for the distance of 400 feet to Cross Street. Also Boylston Street from Hill to Allen Street. Within stated block there is water and gas services installed. There are also 5 occupied dwellings on the street. (By Petition.)

Article 40. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.) to repair James Street, north of Garfield, or to take any other action thereon. (By Petition.)

## Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the School Committee of Acushnet:

Gentlemen:

The report of the Superintendent of Schools for the year ending December 31, 1927, is hereby submitted.

The first item that I present for your consideration is the estimated budget for the operation of the schools for the year 1928.

General expenses, including salary of superintendent, census enumerator, attendance officer, and office expense	\$3,750.00

By comparison with last year's expenditures, this estimate shows an increase of \$3,613.00, or six and six tenths per cent. The general average in the state is eight per cent.

It is natural that you should ask for the reasons for this increase, they may be itemized as follows: Teachers' salaries, High School tuition, text books, and health.

It may be interesting to you and to the citizens of the town to know just how the money of the School Department is distributed in comparison with the expenditures of school funds within the state.

The \$70.02, in the above table represents the gross cost of the schools to the school department, from this should be deducted the reimbursement by the state on teacher's salaries, amounting to \$6.77 per pupil making a net per pupil cost of \$64.25.

To some extent the difference in the per pupil cost of teachers' may be accounted for in the fact that we do not

maintain a high school; but more especially, I think, that unlike other school systems in the state we do not employ supervisors in drawing, penmanship, or physical education. All these are desirable, in fact a necessity in any well directed school system of today.

#### TEACHERS

Last year we had the normal amount of resignations from our teaching force. Four teachers resigned to accept more remunerative positions. To fill these positions two teachers were taken from the graduating class of the Hyannis Normal School, one from the Fitchburg Normal School, and one from the Leslie Training School of Boston.

One new teacher was added to the force. Under the compulsory law relating to children retarded as to grade we established a special school for such pupils at the Mason W. Burt School. Miss Clara McCann was engaged as teacher of this class. To help prepare her for this work Miss McCann took the six week course for teachers of this subject at the State Normal School at Hyannis. That she is efficient in her work is attested by the type of work she is doing. Chairs have been caned, rugs have been drawn and woven, shoe-brushes, hat brushes and hand brushes have been made, baskets woven, and innumerable other articles are in process of construction. I hope that an opportunity will be given before the school year is over for you and the townspeople to see some of this creditable work. It is to be regretted that there is not room at the Burt School for manual training benches for this class.

Another source of pleasure to the Superintendent is the extra amount of outside work that our teachers are doing as well as their school duties. In the Long Plain School there is a very thriving 4 H club, sewing classes for the sixth, seventh, and eighth grades, as well as other activities, chief of which is the violin class. At the Marie S. Howard

School there is another 4 H club under efficient management, sewing classes for the upper grades, and a violin class. The Parting Way School has sewing classes in the grammar grades conducted by the teachers of the eighth, two seventh, and sixth grade teachers, a ukelele club, a violin class, a fife class, and a glee club with a chorus of seventy-five voices. All this extra work is done by the teacher without expense to the department. They are to be commended.

I should feel remiss in my duty if I did not again call to your attention the necessity of making some arrangements to take care of our constantly growing class of pupils attending the high schools outside the town. Last year forty-seven pupils from Acushnet enrolled in the New Bedford High School. The tuition rate is \$150. per pupil. The cost of transportation is \$28.54 per pupil, making a total cost of 178.54. This year there is reason to expect an enrollment of at least sixty pupils, from the public school alone. What there will be from the private school is not known at the present time. It is to be supposed that they will send their quota. I am convinced that we can better afford to pay tuitions to New Bedford up to fifteen thousand dollars than we can operate a high school of our own. The average yearly increase in high school cost is approximately \$1,200. At this rate we will soon reach the limit we can afford to pay so much for higher education outside the town.

That the present building at the Parting Ways will have to answer for school purposes for several years is beyond a doubt. This being the case there should be made further permanent repairs. As a matter of economy these repairs could be spread over a period of several years. Six of the rooms need new floors, the hall and stairways need new floors and new treads. The drinking fountain should be taken from the coal cellar and placed in the hallway of the annex. Two of the rooms need new ceilings. The trimmings

on the outside should be painted and gutters connected with the sewer.

A new roof covering on the east side of the Marie S. Howard School is needed. Three of the rooms should have the interior walls re-tinted and the wood work have a coat of varnish.

The rooms and hall ways at the Mason W. Burt School should be tinted another color. The present vivid green absorbs the light and is hard on the eyes of the pupils.

Two rooms at the Long Plain School should be re-tinted and the outside trimmings painted.

The reports of the School Physician, the Nurse, and the Music Supervisor are worthy of your attention.

I hereby extend my thanks to all the school employees of the department, and to the School Committee for their continued support.

## Report of Music Supervisor

---

Dear Sir:—

The general aim of education is to train children to become capable, useful and contented members of society. The development of a fine character and of the desire to be of service to humanity are the results that lie uppermost in the minds of leaders of educational thought. Every school subject is valued in proportion to its contribution to these desired ends.

Music is valued because of its wonderfully stimulating effect upon the very innermost recesses of our subjective life, because of its universal appeal which contributes directly to both of these fundamental purposes of education. By many of the advanced educators of the present day, outside of the preliminary subjects, music is considered the most important subject in the public school curriculum.

Although the beneficent influences of the study of music reaches out in numberless directions, it is generally agreed that the primary aim of music instruction in the public schools should be the development of a lasting love for the best in music and an appreciation of it.

Music is sometimes called the "Universal Language," or, "The Language of the Soul." These phrases truly state the great purpose of music, for, better than any other medium,

music gives expression to the inner Subjective- Life. Through music great souls have given expression to the deepest universal emotions. Even the simplest songs may often touch an inner chord which responds to no other stimulus.

Throughout our entire school system the boys and girls are showing much more desire to know music and are responding more readily to its advancement. At present there are ninety studying or playing some instrument. We have this year formed the following: A fife class, a ukelele club for girls, a harmonica club for boys, a mixed glee club from the upper grades numbering seventy-five. Here we are using four part music. Classes in violin instruction in the Marie S. Howard and Long Plain schools are proving effective.

There is a great need in all the schools for more private work on the various instruments so that our school orchestra may be built up along a broader plan. My being associated with the schools and teachers but one day a week gives me too little time to go into detail work as we should do.

I was especially gratified with the music of our graduation last June and hope as each succeeding year passes we will be able to give a program of higher order.

The grade work of the several schools is rapidly improving with the co-operation of the teachers, we have much to be proud of.

My sincere thanks are extended to all of these workers.

## Report of School Nurse

---

My dear Mr. Holmes:

I feel that the health program given by your teachers in your class rooms have been largely instrumental in the good health of our school children throughout the town for the year 1927. The good food and sanitary habits taught here have been deeply impressed upon the minds of the children and we are getting results.

We had an epidemic of mumps and one or two cases of diphtheria all of which were slight cases.

Our great problem is still the correction of teeth. I regret to say that after the children, teachers and nurse have worked so hard to obtain dentists supplies, we have been unable to obtain co-operation of a dentist to help us out of this difficulty. Much has been done toward keeping the teeth clean and sound, but many of our children have practically lost their six year molars before they enter school.

Many of our mothers are making good use of the dental clinic at St. Luke's Hospital; which helps to take care of the problem.

## Report of School Physician

Mr. Charles H. Holmes,

Dear Mr. Holmes:—

At the close of another school year it becomes a duty as well as a great pleasure to submit another, our third report, as Medical Supervisor of the Schools of Acushnet.

Each year brings it special duties, problems and disappointments and I assure you this year has been no exception.

Our first complete physical examination was finished earlier than usual, thanks to the co-operation of principals, teachers and the school nurse in the various schools, which enables us to devote the balance of the school year to a more careful observation of physical conditions of those most deficient.

It has been a great satisfaction to note the marked improvement in postural as well as throat conditions, the result of the co-operation of teachers and parents, whom we believe are beginning to realize the value of early intervention in these disorders, and their correction before more serious and chronic disorders become established. Our percentage of underweights and throat defects are steadily decreasing. This improvement while most noticeable in the upper grades is becoming more so in the lower, the result

of pre-school work done the last year. We hope to be able to do more of this pre-school work as parents of children about to enter school realize the great advantage of having their children in as near perfect physical condition as possible when **entering** school.

To date there has been no serious outbreak of any contagious disease and we would request greater attention to the reporting of cases of the same by parents, thus avoiding any epidemic however small. Our tonsil clinics have been greater than ever before which accounts for a decrease in throat diseases.

We regret that while having a good equipment and being prepared for dental work, all efforts to find a Dentist willing to sacrifice enough time to enable us to start a dental clinic have failed but we still hope to find one with time and inclination and interest enough in the children to enable us to start work.

The segregation of pupils retarded as to grade has been a step in advance and will we hope enable them to be closer observed and such physical defects as may be retarding them removed. While this segregation has been a source of added expense we believe it will be compensated for by vital improvement. We believe the facts and experience gained each year will enable us to do more intelligent work and produce correspondingly marked improvement.

We will therefore close thanking School Committee, Superintendent, teachers and parents for their co-operation of the past year and asking from all just a little more the coming year.
