REPORT OF ACUSHNET WATER COMMISSIONERS.

To the residents of Acushnet:

In presenting its fifth annual report, the Acushnet Water Board makes the following explanations—The planning and laying out of a water system calls for a constant and consistent adherence to well laid and definite plans, and more so in this day of high cost of installation. Each water main laid is an integral part of a permanent system; and must be so placed as to give the maximum service at the minimum expense, also to be capable of constant enlargement as the population increases.

In order to do this, your Board has endeavored to weigh each demand, and after due consideration has decided which was the most needy district, and has then placed the responsibility of the lay out upon a practical engineer of whom they have demanded the cheapest route with the greatest possibility of efficiency.

On account of the drouth the present year has been one of unusual demands, and the Board has been sorely tried to satisfy every one; but if they have failed to please every one, it has been on account of financial conditions rather than lack of interest.

We have doubled our water system the present year, supplying a long felt want in a most needy territory; and opening up a possibility of rapid development of this section. In so doing, we have greatly lessened the fire hazard, and insured greatly improved sanitary conditions; with a probable prevention of any epidemic in this location.

This brings a greater strain on our finances, and we do not see how we can extend the system any further than at present.

GREETING:

In the name of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Acushnet qualified to vote in town affairs to meet at the Town Hall, in said town on Monday the Seventh day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon (the polls may close at 2 o'clock p. m.) to act upon the following articles, viz:

Article 1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Article 2. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year viz:

Town Clerk, Treasurer and Collector of Taxes, for one year.

Three Selectmen and Overseers of the Poor, one year.

One Assessor for three years.

One School Committeeman for three years.

One member Board of Health for three years.

One Trustee for Free Public Library for three years.

One Water Commissioner for three years.

One member of Cemetery Board for three years.

One Auditor for one year.

Three Constables for one year.

Surveyors of Lumber, Pound Keeper, Field Drivers, Fence Viewers and Tree Warden, for one year.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to determine the compensation which the several town officers shall receive and make an appropriation therefor.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to procure its Treasurer and Collector's bond and to determine for what amount they shall be bonded.

Article 5. To appropriate a sum of money for the support of the poor.

Article 6. To appropriate a sum of money for the support of schools.

For the salary of the Superintendent of Schools.

For transportation of High School pupils.

For tuition of Industrial School pupils.

For High School tuition.

For support of Free Public Library.

Article 7. To appropriate a sum of money for incidental expenses.

No damages were allowed.

Hope Street.

Article 20. To hear the report of the Selectmen relative to the laying out of Hope St., from the east line of South Main street to the west line of John street, and see if the Town will vote to accept said layout as a street or town way as established by the Selectmen in their order of notice of February 14, 1921, laying out the same. A plan of the layout of said Hope street, made by Wilfred T. Fahey, dated February 12, 1921, as approved by the Board of Selectmen, February 16, 1921, and filed in the office of the Town Clerk of Acushnet. This street is forty (40) feet wide. No damages were allowed.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,634.53, the Town's proportional part, for the care, maintenance and repair of the Bristol County Tuberculosis Hospital, from January 1, 1920 to December 31, 1920, under Chapter 286, Section 9, Acts of 1916, to be paid on or before the first day of April 1921.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to install four (4) street lights on Jean street, between Nye and River streets, and appropriate a sum of money therefor.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to have street lights burning until 12 o'clock P. M.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to close all stores, with the exception of Drug Stores, on the Lord's Day, or take any action thereon.

Article 25. To see if the Town will appropriate three hundred (\$300) dollars for forest fires, two hundred (\$200) dollars for dwelling fires, and one hundred fifty (\$150) dollars for an electric gong, lock, extinguishers, shovels, lanterns, etc.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to have all contract papers drawn up by the Board of Selectmen of 1921, and other official accounts to be delivered over to the Board of Selectmen for 1922.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Board of Selectmen to petition the Legislature for twenty thousand (\$20,000) dollars to be expended on the main highways.

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate one thousand (\$1,000) dollars, to be expended on Quaker street for re-surfacing the macadam with Barrett Company Tarvia, and re-gravel to the extend of appropriation.

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REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

To the School Committee of Acushnet:
Gentlemen:

The eighth annual report of the present superintendent of schools is herewith submitted.

ATTENDANCE.

The total enrollment for the year ending in June 1920 was 722. The average membership 608 and the average attendance 567. The attendance record was fairly good in view of the bad weather and prevalent illness. The present actual enrollment is 660. Due to the business depression it has decreased slightly since the beginning of the year. It shows, however, an increase of about fifty over the number at the same time last year.

Expenditures for schools have increased very rapidly everywhere. In Acushnet the cost has apparently advanced abnormally. In 1915 the total expenses were \$10,400 and this year \$32,652, an increase of over 200 percent. It would not be strange if the tax payer inquired as to the extravagance of the school department. What are the facts?

In 1915 the average membership of your schools for the year was 308. In 1920 it was 608, an advance of 97 percent. It has been over 650 since September. In 1915 the average cost of educating a grade pupil in Massachusetts was \$40.94. In Acushnet it was \$33.76. No State figures are available for the fiscal year just closed but in 1919 the average cost of educating a pupil in Massachusetts was \$57.48. It is undoubtedly much larger this year. In Acushnet it was \$53.70. The facts in regard to school expenditures in Acushnet do not justify the accusation of extravagance. They do indicate some progress for whereas in 1915 the town spent \$8.15 per capita less than the state average, in 1920 it spent only \$3.40 less.

The rank of Acushnet in respect to expenditure for schools per thousand dollars of its valuation is high. It is

one of the best towns in the state. It makes an effort to have good schools. On the other hand the unusually large number of children for a town of its size brings the expenditure per capita below the average. If a man has an unusually large family, even high wages are not sufficient to buy more than necessities. A similar condition exists in Acushnet. The town is relatively poor. It taxes itself heavily for schools. The number of children is such as to enable only the absolute essentials of educational facilities.

An increase of \$9,525 in the appropriation is asked for while the estimates call for only \$4,000 more. Why so large an appropriation? There are several reasons:

1—The valuation of Acushnet was \$1,762,771 in 1919; it is now \$2,567,442. The increase of the valuation to a point beyond \$2,500,000 automatically takes away from the town the State aid on account of superintendent and the right to a share in the Massachusetts State School Fund. This loses the town \$1700. Furthermore the General School Fund is distributed on the basis of valuation per pupil in the membership. The increase is such as to reduce the amount that would be paid the town next year from this fund. We shall lose \$1000 compared with that received last year and \$1600 or more from what would otherwise be our apportionment next year. The increase in valuation loses to the town, therefore, the sum of \$3,000 which must be made up by an appropriation.

2—Last year there was a balance of \$3392, due to the late arrival of the General School Fund. It saved that amount in the appropriation of 1920. We have no such balance this year.

3—In so far as the increase asked for is to be used for school purposes, it is caused by the necessity of hiring two more teachers in March, when it is expected the new building will be open, and the need of money enough to carry the present scale of salaries through the year. The increases now in force were not made until September, hence some of them have run only fifteen weeks.

If it were not for an anticipated decrease in the amount to be paid for transportation after the new building is opened and a reduction of the amount to be used for new equipment, the sum asked for would not be sufficient. The estimate does not include money for any improvements in school facilities or school work some of which ought to be made. Permit me to mention a few of these.

TOILETS AT PARTING WAYS.

There are over four hundred children at the Parting Ways School. The toilet facilities are of the most ancient type. They are absolutely unhygienic. If typhoid fever once started they would foster an epidemic. They are a menace to the health of the school and the community. New toilets should be placed in the basement of the school.

MANUAL TRAINING.

There are many boys in our schools who have unusual mechanical capacity. No effort is made to develop this in the school. The boys are held strictly to a routine of books. There is no outlet for their natural ability to use their hands. They have no opportunity to find themselves thru a variety in their school occupations. If manual training was introduced it would give life to the school work of the boys and would have valuable educational results.

DOMESTIC SCIENCE.

The schools are maintained to aid the home in fitting for citizenship. A good home is a fundamental agency toward this end. If the mother understands sewing and cooking the home is made thereby much better. In the old days the mother taught the daughter these subjects. This is not generally true now. There are some homes where the mother has not time, others where she has not the disposition, and still others where she has not the skill. It is desirable therefore that the school should supplement the home. Cooking and sewing should certainly be taught to girls even if some other subjects have to be omitted. Acushnet needs greatly domestic science in its schools. Every other town in the superintendency district has both manual training and domestic science.

HEALTH SUPERVISION AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION.

The importance of health supervision has been mentioned in previous reports. It cannot be over emphasized. Acushnet is doing practically nothing along this line. The law requires that an individual examination of each pupil be made annually. That is not being done. If it was done, it would cost much more than the present appropriation allows for medical inspection. It is one of the things that should be undertaken next year. The law requires that notices of the physical condition of the child be sent home. These notices are relatively valueless unless parents act upon them. They will not do so unless through explanation and advice by a school nurse. I know of no agency that would be more effective in promoting the general health in Acushnet schools than the employment of a school nurse on part time. It would be her duty to inspect the schools regularly, to watch

for the early symptoms of contagious diseases, to visit the homes and carry there advice and instruction in regard to the physical care of the children. In time this would make a great difference in the health and happiness of the future men and women now in Acushnet schools.

The above additions to your school system are mentioned and advocated because they would be of certain value to the children. That they are not already in the schools is not due to lack of appreciation of their importance by the superintendent or school committee, but is because the finances of the school department have never been sufficient to introduce them. It is the business of every citizen to care for the welfare of the children. The voters condition what can be done for them. I recommend most earnestly that these features of a modern school system be incorporated in Acushnet schools next year. They can be if \$5,000 is added to the above estimates.

TEACHERS.

You expended for teachers last year nearly \$15,000. The amount estimated for 1921 is \$20,000. This includes less than \$1,000 for increases in salaries now paid. An advance was made in September so that grade teachers serving their second year have received at the rate of \$1,000 annually since then. As stated before, this wage has been in effect only four months and a part of the increased estimate for teachers is to enable carrying it through until June. The addition of two more teachers to your corps will make nineteen grade teachers in your employ in addition to a supervisor of music. It is obvious that, including higher salaries for the principals, the average salary per grade teacher will not be \$1,000. This is not enough to secure experienced teachers. We shall always have, therefore, a corps made up quite largely of beginners. Our maximum of \$1,000 per year is small compared with \$1,700 in New Bedford, especially since most of our teachers board in New Bedford and are subject to the same living costs as New Bedford teachers. The average salary paid throughout the state in towns of Acushnet's class is \$1,071. It is easy to see that we are not paying too much for teachers.

Eleven teachers have resigned in Acushnet since the last report. It was a difficult matter to replace them as the teacher shortage became acute in the summer. On the whole you have a corps fully up to the average of the past in

Acushnet. Each of the three buildings has an excellent principal, and a high degree of progress in school work is being made.

It is often suggested that with the decline of wages in other occupations, salaries of teachers must decrease. This is not probable in the near future, if at all. The United States Commissioner of Education reported in October, two months ago, that there was a shortage of 90,000 teachers and that there were many untrained teachers in service. The report of the special commission on teachers salaries, appointed by Governor Coolidge, says:

"One of the most disturbing conditions which the commission has found in the course of its investigation is the decreased enrollment in the state normal schools. Since 1917 there has been marked decrease amounting to 37 per cent in the number of men and 27 per cent in the number of women." The classes this fall are somewhat larger but teachers now beginning training will not be available until 1922 or later. Massachusetts has in the past drawn quite heavily on other states for its teacher supply. Salaries in these states have materially advanced and this source of supply has been much diminished. The law of supply and demand alone will certainly operate to keep salaries up for two years more and perhaps longer. Apart from the law of supply and demand there are sound reasons for paying teachers more than is paid in many other occupations. Public sentiment in most communities has been aroused to the necessity of doing this and those towns that lower their salaries in the future will be able to secure only an inferior quality of teachers.

BUILDINGS.

The Marie S. Howard school was ready for occupation in March. At the present time one hundred sixty-eight children are housed there. When the new building on Fairhaven Road is ready about forty children who are now being conveyed to Middle Road will attend the former school.

The Marie S. Howard school is a good school for the money invested. The cost seems to many excessive but, compared with other school house construction throughout the state, it is very low. The average cost per room is now about \$14,000. It is obvious that less than \$8,000 expended per room on the Marie S. Howard school was not sufficient to purchase the best construction.

The new school on Fairhaven road is well under way.

It is also of the single story type but it has no auditorium. The building includes four rooms two of which will be finished this year. It is designed as an eight room building so that four more rooms may easily be added without disproportionate expense. The plan of the building is excellent and the appearance when completed will be satisfactory. The cost of this building is greater than that of the Marie S. Howard because building costs were greater than when the contract for the Marie S. Howard was let. It is a building with no unused space and with the cost reduced to a minimum. It will be a substantial school, which, with additions, will serve the town for several years unless there is a phenomenal increase in the number of pupils.

COURSE OF STUDY.

During the summer the course of study was thoroughly revised and new outlines made in arithmetic, geography and civics. The whole in written form was in the hands of the teachers in September. It is of course impossible to do more during the first year than make a beginning in the realization of the aims in the new course of study. Considerable adjustment to the capacity of children is always necessary. There is now, however, a very definite program and better results must accrue.

A special effort is being made for better work in arithmetic. The author of the method manual in use was one of the speakers at an institute held by the teachers in February and he has since addressed them and conducted demonstration classes. Indications point to marked improvement of the results in this subject.

In closing permit me to express to the teachers my appreciation of their earnest work and to the school committee my thanks for its interests, continued co-operation and support.
